




# AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO ALL RESIDENTS OF GROVE GREEN AND WEAVERING FROM BOXLEY PARISH COUNCIL

Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) has commenced a Community Governance Review that could change how your area is run. In this first stage they are asking for your views through two consultations.

Grove Green and Weavering are currently a much valued part of Boxley Parish. Residents can fill in the surveys online at <u>'Let's Talk Maidstone'</u> or ask your Parish Council for a paper copy and we will deliver it to you together with a return envelope.

# MBC describe the following possible options:

- · Remain part of Boxley Parish
- · Have its own Parish
- · Join up with Thurnham West to create a new Parish
- · Join a new Maidstone Town Council

# Parish Councils offer services and facilities to help improve their areas and to provide a voice for local residents.

Parish Councils are funded in part by an element in your council tax called the 'precept'. In 2024/25 Boxley Parish Council (BPC) received £125,729 from Grove Green and Weavering residents which was £70.15 for the year for a Band D property. This leaflet shows how BPC used your Precept in 2024/25 and the services it provides for residents.

£3,920 - Grass cutting

£7,500 - Grant to Vinters Valley Nature Reserve

£1,880 - Additional Grant for Vinters Valley Nature Reserve for new gazebos for their educational programme and other events

£783 - Two new benches

£974 - Maintenance and upkeep of play areas at Franklin Drive and Weavering Diamond Jubilee Orchard

£1,600 - Grant to Grove Green Village Hall in 2024 for CCTV upgrade

£250 - To a summer play scheme used by Grove Green and Weavering residents

£405 - (pro rata) in other grants that support the community

£150 - To the Friends of Weavering Heath to help with the the maintenance of this outdoor space

£55,810 – A pro rata percentage of the Parish administration/Councillor allowances/ maintenance of allotments and the burial ground

Total spend of £73,272

The Council should have a general reserve of 3-12 months of the Precept value for unforeseen circumstances. BPC currently has a reserve of just under 6 months of the precept value. Remaining funds from unspent maintenance budgets are put into specific reserves to fund replacement equipment, large repairs, etc. for areas maintained by the Parish Council. Further information on finance and the Parish Council accounts are available for all residents to view at the Parish Office.

Boxley Parish Council always welcomes suggestions for improvements to your local area.

# Boxley Parish Council currently provides the following to residents of Grove Green and Weavering and is committed to maintaining the current level of service in the following key areas

# **ALLOTMENTS**

Dove Hill allotments are currently available to Grove Green and Weavering residents. Current Allotment Rules state that allotment holders must live within one mile of the parish boundary and priority is given to Boxley Parish residents.



# **VINTERS VALLEY NATURE RESERVE**

Boxley Parish Council is Custodian Trustee for the reserve. Last year, Boxley Parish Council provided £7,500 to the reserve, which helps fund its full-time warden. Boxley Parish Council also provided an additional grant of £1,880 for new gazebos for their educational programme and other events.



The burial ground at St Mary and All Saints Church in Boxley is currently available for interments for Grove Green and Weavering residents. This would cease should Grove Green and Weavering leave Boxley Parish. This will not affect those with existing plots that wish to be buried with their loved ones. BPC is also responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the closed churchyard.





# FRANKLIN DRIVE PLAY AREA

This play area was proposed for closure by MBC in 2018 but saved by BPC in 2019. BPC continues to maintain the trees, play equipment and grounds.



This open space is leased from MBC. It was developed by BPC from bare ground in 2012. It is managed by BPC which has provided new play equipment, and fruit trees for residents' benefit.



# **VILLAGE HALLS**

Boxley Parish Council provides practical help and financial help to both Weavering Village Hall and Grove Green Community Hall. The Parish Council is Custodian Trustee for Grove Green Community Hall.

## **VILLAGE GREEN AREAS**

Boxley Parish Council supports Weavering Heath, Five-Acre Wood and Wents Wood with a regular grant to the Friends of Weavering Heath.



# How we help you

## **LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATION ON HIGHWAY ISSUES**

Boxley Parish Council petitions Maidstone Borough Council and Kent County Council on highways issues such as the need for double yellow lines, traffic surveys, speeding, nuisance parking, street cleaning, and any other concerns raised by residents. BPC is liaising with the STEM school over parking issues in Grove Green and funding safety audits in GrovewoodDrive North/New Cut Road and Weavering Street.

### **PLANNING SUPPORT**

MBC consults Boxley Parish Council on all local planning applications within the Parish. We respond to and monitor planning applications, including those that are controversial. It also supports residents when making planning applications and assists with their objections or comments.

### **GRANT APPLICATIONS**

Boxley Parish Council gives grants to community groups and organisations in Grove Green and Weavering, including:

2020/21 - £5,845 New roof for Weavering Village Hall

2023 - £1,500 New water heater for Grove Green Community Hall 2024 - £1,600 CCTV upgrade for Grove Green Community Hall

Annually - £250 Bearsted Summer play school used by Grove Green and Weavering residents.

### STAFF

Boxley Parish Council has four experienced members of staff available to deal with queries and provide advice, including a Parish Caretaker who is available during weekdays to deal with emergencies such as broken/damaged play equipment and carries out regular inspections and repairs to the play areas. Office staff are happy to report issues to Maidstone Borough Council and Kent County Council on residents' behalf.

Boxley Parish Council holds 44 meetings a year, including some held in Weavering Village Hall. We work with Maidstone Borough Council and Kent County Council to ensure the effective delivery of their services.

There are currently 13 Parish Councillors. They can be approached by residents from across the Parish with queries or concerns. 6 of these Councillors live in or represent Grove Green and Weavering. The Parish Council currently has 2 vacancies for Councillors. If you would like to apply please contact the Clerk for more information.
